memory do make my last will & Testament in manner following
I impinge I give my Land & plantation to my son
Thomas Henry Landor Landor & to him being forever the
tract purchased of Henry Vogel & William Young to
be in one Lot (viz) Each tract to be valued by three honest
men by them impartially chosen & named to have all said

I promise the second of Feb: next the last day of the month
I and the highest officer to pay the sum ordering the difference
in money of 1000 dollars each one for equal. I will also desire
that of Feb: next may have the use of the tract of land whereon I
now have for the space of six years citizen Decades or until
I can seal myself to no other action on his own Land with
out being subject to pay any rent for the same I had to my
Daughter Sarah Covington my neare woman (Dividit for
during her natural life & at her decease) give her to her chil-
dren to be equally among them in no wise subject to pay her
debts of her Husband Wm Covington I give to my Daughter
Sarah Covington one young whale which is now in her possession
and give to my son Rubin Covington four sheep & one sow &
2 pigs. I give to my Grand Daughter Sally Cooper one cow &

194. I give to my Grand Daughter Betsy Cooper one hundred
Lamb & the feather Bed & furniture she commonly lies on also a long
Chair. The remainder of my negroes with their future increase
I give to be equally divided among my Children (H H) Thomas
Henry, Rubin, Ody, Sarah & Susanna & my Grand Daughter
Ody, Daughter of my deceased Daughter Margaret Cooper to
them either heirs or ever. None of the negroes which may be allotted
to any of the women except Betsy Cooper, to be subject in any
wise to - pay the debts of their Husband. The remainder
of my estate both of what nature or kind soever I give to be equally
Divided among my Children (H H) Thomas, Henry,
Rubin, Ody, Sarah & Susanna above named, and my
Grand sons Vincent & Lewis Sparrowsong, William Cooper
and Margaret his wife the said Vincent & Lewis to have
but one third between them to them and their heirs forever.

wise to - pay the Debts of their Husbands. The Remainder
of my estate both of what nature or kind soever, I give to be equally
Divided, amongst my Children (H&L) Thomas, Henry,

and Margaret his wife the said Vincent Lewis to have
but one part between them to them and their heirs forever -
I also by this constitute & Appoint my son Thomas Henry and
Reuben Carpenter & my son in law Reuben Cowerton having
to this my will hereby revoking all other wills by me made
In Testimony whereof I have caused to set my hand & affixed
my seal this 16th Day of February in the year of our Lord
1778.
