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daughter Sarah Lane's part I give to my three granddaughters Jane Lane, Sarah Lane and Molly Lane, to be equally divided amongst them and their heirs forever. I give my daughter Susannah Crittendon's part I lent her to her daughter Catharine and her heirs forever, and it is my will and desire if either of my four granddaughters above named should die without heir that the part that falleth to them should be equally divided among the survivors, and I do constitute and appoint my worthy friends Mr. John Upshaw, Mr. Thomas Sale, and William Webb, executors of this my last Will and Testament.
