with all my Estate during her life the same which I have been
living in the settlement I have to my wife to have and enjoy
for a period of years so that the same or principal part of my
Estate after that period of years shall remain after her decease
that all my Estate be sold of publicly and equally divided
amongst my children then living South, Joseph and my
wife and my Brother in Law James William my Executors
James Smith

amongst my children then living South, Totham my living
wife and my Mother in Law Jane Williams my daughter and
Executor of Thomas last Will and Testament for testimony
whereof I have set my hand and seal this 9 day of March
1777.
