At a Court continued and held for Essex County at Tappan on the 17th day of April 1787. This last Will and Testament of John Chamberlain dec'd was presented into Court by Leonard Chamberlain one of the Executors therein named who made oath thereto as the Law directs. and the same being proved by James Allen and Charles Broach two of the Witnesses thereto is ordered to be recorded. And at the same time the said Executor produced an Instrument of writing which was proved by the Witnesses aforesaid to be a Codicil to the said Will which is also ordered to be recorded.
