half a score sheep with my Gun and Baggage with its powder and my two pistols. To my wife Mary, Ann
Charlotte I leave the residue of my Estate during her (William's) life. subject of her self and my children
not already provided for meaning my son Henry my son Mary in William my daughter Mary and my
daughter Catherine but in case she should die my wife and I agree that it is my will and desire that as my Estate grows
to be in paper securities what be sold at death or before William's death should be paid to her and nothing
more she lives on meaning the Land I bought of James Johnson and the Land I purchased of (a) William
Dingessville and these lands and houses with their appurtenances I leave to my wife I give to my son
Thomas Clement immediately after his mother's decease, again or until I give him my share for
my wife Mary and I give to my son John during his natural life and it is my will and desire she
shall have the disposal of these Negroes with Maria Book and Jack during my lifetime as she shall think
proper also I give my wife my Gun Buttons my Chair or Chair with a pair of my best Bows my Harp and
other things belonging to me and at her disposal in like manner also my money of paper and the best bed
and furniture in my house and my fine horse (Clement's) I give to my wife and I give to my son Henry
to put into commission anything my wife and I have daughters and that to be charged to my estate. I give
it is my will that in my estate both real and personal what be sold at the death or marriage of my wife (Mary)
the residue and Negroes shall be given away and out of the money arising from the sale thereof I give to each
of my four children (Mary, my daughter Mary, my son William and my daughter Catherine)
to each of them in equalled portions I give to my daughter Mary my (one) Gun I give to my son William
the residue of my Estate to be equally divided between my daughter Mary, William and my son Henry
Clement (Mary, William and Catherine) I give to my wife and desire that my son Daniel Clement
in consideration for the land and Negroes he I give to him what upon her death or marriage of his mother
she has for her share. Brothers and sisters and children born out of his Estate to live until at the age of twenty
years yet I give to my wife that she have not more than William to contribute and nothing that
is antagonistic to their claims but it is my desire that either Mary or William be appointed and nothing that
my son Daniel Clement and to be
