my personal Estate movable & immovable consisting of Stock &c

Kindred & Household & Children Furniture of household to them & his heirs for
them I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Milly Durn one negro Girl
named Rachel to her & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever

Them give & bequeath unto my two grand Children Polly & Anthony Turner one
negro child named Cloe & her child since to be delivered to them when
they come of age or come to the age of eighteen years & to be equally divided
between them both

Them I give & bequeath unto my grand Daughter Elizabeth Dickerson
Twenty five pounds to her & her heirs forever to be paid her when she comes
to the age of eighteen years

And lastly I appoint my son John Dickerson & my friend John Brown my
executors to this my last will & testament wherein I make and give all
things twenty second day of July one Thousand seven hundred & seventy eight
