In the name of God amen I John Dobbins of Essex County being weak in body but sound in mind & memory do make & declare this my last will & Testament in manner & form as followeth. I give unto my sister Sarah an negro woman name M d & an negro Girl name Joane During her natural life upon paying thirty pounds to my Brother Thomas Dobbins in Gold or Silver. I give unto my sister Joane an One negro boy Daniel During her natural life upon paying twenty pounds to my brother Thomas Dobbins. I give the two negroes I lent to my sister Sarah at her Death I give to be equally divided amongst her five children Anne Susan Mary Abner Elizabeth & William Dobbins to them & their heirs forever.

Tell the negro Boy Nens my better Mary at her Death I give to be Equally Divided between William
Jordan & Thomas Jordan to have their heirs forever — Tell I give my mare named to Saml Dunn
Saddle & Bridle to him & his heirs forever — Tell my will & Desire is that Out of the Rest of my personal
Estate my Just Debts should be paid & General expences & then all the rest I give to my better Sarah
to her & her heirs forever — Lastly I constitute Cornelius Brown my Executor to this my last will and
Testament Given from under my hand & Seal this the 2th of January One Thousand seven hundred
and Eighty three
