Sam, and at his death I give him to my Grandson Ra-

James, Thomas and Major Fogg all my land and Planta-
-tation in King & Queen County to be Equally divided
among them according to Quantity and Quality Item I
give to my Son James Fogg one Negro Lad, named,

Boy called Little Ben, Item I give to my Son Major
Fogg one Negro Boy named Charles. Item I give to
my Daughter Anne Will one Negro Girl now in her
-possession named Luce, Item I lend to my Daughter
Elizabeth Saylor one Negro Lad named Ned dur-
-ing her natural life and at her Death the sd

Mary Keese one Negro Girl named Fener Sally. Item I
give to my Daughter Katherine Elliot one Negro Girl

point my Beloved Wife, James Fogg my Son and Thomas
Fogg my Son Executors to this my last Will and Testament.
