In the name of God amen I Joseph Mann of the parish of Southwicham in the County of Essex being in perfect sense & sound memory do make this my last will & testament in manner & form whereat before my Incomparable wife Rachel Countess my present wife last by a writing bearing date the 4th day of May 1767 mutually agreed between us that in case we should live together five years & she would relinquish her right of Dower to all my lands in case she should be the longest liver that then & in such case I oblige myself to leave her a negro boy named Richmond & one other negro the choice of all my Slaves which she was to have during her Life & after decease both the said Slaves to return to my estate Likewise agreed that in case I should die within the time aforesaid that the said Rachel should be entitled to all the money I might receive for the rent of her land & what other estate she bought me which writing thereby conform on my part proved the said Rachel abides by the same on her part according to her contract under hand & seal before witnesses made the day & year above mentioned & which she hath since faithfully performed as do be I Item I Give & bequeath to my Son John Mann all my ~~manor~~ lands that my Son Robert Mann lives on & my Quarter lands adjoining to it & negroes ^{and} names Charles, ~~negro~~ ^{negro} ~~girl~~ ^{negro} named Mary & my Quarter Slave to him & his heirs forever

IEM I give & bequeath to my son Augustine Mann part of the land I bought of Mr. Dunbar
 where he now lives upon down to my Spring branch & up the branch to my Spring & from
 thence to and so by the road & so up the road to the land I purchased of Thomas Murr his
 corner by the road a all that parcel of land I bought of the said Murr to him & his heirs
 forever. IEM I give & bequeath to my son Robert Mann the land plantation where I now
 live & all the land I bought of Mr. Dunbar below my Spring branch & an negro girl named Alice
 to him & his heirs forever. IEM I give to my daughter Ann Lewis an negro girl named
 Hannah to her & her heirs forever. IEM I give to my daughter Mary Lowe an negro girl
 named Lenny to her & her heirs forever. IEM I give to my daughter Sarah Lowrey an negro man
 named Ben to her & her heirs forever. IEM I give to my son Robert Mann my steer where
 I now live to him & his heirs forever. IEM It is my will & desire that all the rest & residue
 of my money out standing debts & estate of what kind I ever not already disposed of should be
 equally divided between my five children Robert Mann, John Mann & Augustine Mann
 & Ann Lewis Mary Lowe & Sarah Lowrey to them & their heirs forever. And my daughter Ann Lewis
 part I lend to her during her life & then to be divided between her children that she shall
 have alive by Richard Lewis. IEM I give to my three sons Robert Mann John Mann And
 Augustine Mann all my wearing apparel to be equally divided between them. IEM It is my
 will & desire that at the death of my wife Rachel Mann whatever part & sum of her dower
 in my estate shall be equally divided between my five children Robert Mann John Mann
 Augustine Mann Ann Lewis Mary Lowe & Sarah Lowrey.

Augustine Mann all my wearing apparel to be equally divided between them. It is my
woud desire that at the Death of my wife Rachel Mann whatever part & sum of her Dowry
in my estate shall be equally divided between my six children Robert Mann John Mann
Augustine Mann. Ann Lewis. Mary Jones Sarah Rounley & Lady Noustute and
Appoint my two sons Robert Mann & John Mann to Executors of this last will & Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Eighth Day of March in the
Year of our Lord 1777
