and first of all, I give and bequeath my soul into the hands
of Almighty God that gave it, and my Body to the earth to be buried in
a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors, and as
touching such worldly estate as shall in it be pleased by God to leave
me in this life, I give and bequeath of the same in the following
manner - I give to my Daughter Susan Hill one negro Girl
named Nan, and one negro Boy named Robert together with one
Feather Bed and a furniture of eight boards and one painted with an
oil plate - I give to my son William Hill one negro Girl named
Toby and one negro Girl named Pat with one bed and one painted with an
oil plate - I give to my daughter Susan Hill one negro Girl named

in plates — I have given to my son William Hill one negro boy named
Toby and one negro girl named Pat with one bed and furniture and
eight pounds and ten shillings and one plate — I have given to my
son Thomas Hill one negro boy named Phill and one negro girl
named Agge with one bed and one furniture and one plate and
one shilling and one shilling and one shilling — I have given to my daughter
Molly Hill one negro boy named Sophia and one negro girl named Mary
together with one bed and one furniture and one shilling and one shilling
and if either my son or daughter should not be satisfied with the
parts I have given them be equally divided among the other two
or three and if either the negroes I have given are before a year
or if my son or daughter should not be satisfied with the
of my principal estate to make all my children equal, I have
said to my beloved wife Sarah Hill and the remainder of my estate
both real and personal according to natural life — I have
and at her decease my land to be divided by her personal estate and
personal estate equally divided between my two sons William Hill and
Thomas Hill and the remainder of my estate to be divided between the two

and if either my sons or daughters die, such out lay for their share
parts I have given them be equally divided among the survivors
in their heirs and if either the negroes I have given are before the death
one of my estate that the value of such negro or negroes be added

sent to my beloved wife Sarah Hill all the remainder of my estate
both real and personal concerning her natural life, and from her
and at her decease my land to be divided by her personal choice for the

Thomas Hill according to the quantity and quality of the same
and that William Hill do pay to his sister Sarah Hill half the
value of the part of land that Thomas Hill do pay for his share
And that the said Sarah Hill receive half the value of the part of land
my wife do pay to my son Thomas Hill and that my son Thomas
do pay to his sister Sarah Hill half the value of the part of land
my wife do pay to my son William Hill and that my son William
