Item I give to my daughter Lucia Sale one negro called great

Simon, one negro girl called Phoebe, one negro boy named Life,

and one old wench named Moll, Item I give to my son Le-

onard Sale one negro girl named Ann, and one boy called

little Simon, and also a negro man and an old wench
named Sarah and I desire that if either my children die

little Simon, and a young negro man and an Old woman
named Sarah, and I desire that if either my children die
before they come of age that the part I have left them be
equally divided between the surviving Turnover
Brothers and sisters and all the ~~sons~~ and remainder of my estate
not herebefore mentioned I leave to my beloved wife dur-
ing her natural life, and at the Decease to be equally divided
amongst all my children, and I appoint my beloved wife
Mary Sate, Meriday Prewin, and James Sullivan my
Executors, to this my last Will and Testament Witness
