in manner & form following. First -

I give & bequeath unto my Son Gilbee Furman all my Claim of debts &
-worth recovered of James Ware, of King & Queens County on Acct. of my
debt, in Land, recovered in the above County Court by law, also.

I give and bequeath unto said Son Gilbee Furman, Twelve pounds due for
rent, last year & Nine pounds a year for rent, which I am to receive
-annually, as long as I shall live. Also all the remainder of my Estate,
be it of what kind soever, I Give & bequeath unto him, & his heirs
forever, & lastly, I nominate & appoint, my Son Gilbee Furman
whole & Sole Ex. of this my last will & testament as witness my
hand & Seal & dated this the 13th day of March 17th 1726.
