what soever of what nature kind or property so ever
the same be or can be found, to him and his heirs
of his Body Lawfully begotten for ever But further my
Will and Desire is that if the said Nathan Pinedown
we should die without heirs Lawfully begotten of his
Body for ever that then the said Land together with
all the rest of my estate to descend to and remain to
Charles Pinedown to him and then his heirs for ever
