Testament, in Manner & Form following.

like Manner as my Executors shall think proper; trusting to the me-
=rits of our beloved Redeemer for the Salvation of my Soul.

Item, it is my Desire that all the worldly Goods, which it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me with, except such as are particularly devised hereafter, shall
be sold by my Executors and the money arising therefrom be disposed of as
I shall hereafter direct. In the first place it is my Will that all my Just
Duties be paid. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane
Merrithew M^{rs} thirty pounds, to be paid out of the Money arising
from the Sale of my Estate, to her & her Heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath all the rest & Remainder of the Money
arising from the Sale of my Estate, & whatever Money may be now due
me, to be equally divided between my two sons William Webb &

George Webb, and my Daughter Jane Morinether Webb to them & each
of them. & their heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary Hammondson
Gray my Negro Girl Winney to her & her heirs forever.

Lastly. I do appoint my son James Webb the Executor of this my last
Will & Testament. Witness my Hand this 15th of March 1786
