I Mary Young of the County of Essex and Parish of South Parham, being in a low state of health and seriously considering the uncertainty of human life, do while in a sound state of mind, make and declare this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following. I do most humbly recommend my soul to the extensive mercy of that Eternal, Supreme, Intelligent being who gave it me, most earnestly at the same time deprecating his Justice. My Body I desire to be interred at the discretion of my Executors to be hereafter named, not doubting of its Resurrection.

I lend unto my son Williamson Young for and during his natural life one hundred Acres Land, which was escheated Land, and which I bought, adjoining the Land I now live on, provided he the said Williamson Young shall not, rent or lease the same during his lifetime, and at his decease, it is my Will that the said Land be sold, and the money arising therefrom be divided among the Children of my son William Young deceased: viz^t Rebecca (now the wife of Henry Young Junr.) Williamson, Elizabeth Gillman, John (and Godfrey), to them and their forever.
I give unto my said son Williamson two beds and furniture, to him my said son and his heirs forever.

I give devise and bequeath unto my grand daughter Rebecca Young the wife of
Henry Young one bed and furniture to her my said grand daughter and her heirs
for ever. I give devise and bequeath unto my granddaughter Elizabeth Young one bed and furniture to her

I give unto my son Williamson one large looking glass, oval black Walnut
Table and Chest of drawers for and during his natural life, (and it is my
will that at his decease the said looking glass, table and Chest of drawers
be sold and the money arising therefrom divided among the children of my
son William as above mentioned.

I give devise and bequeath unto my grand daughter Mary Godfrey Jackson my
largest China bowl to her my said grand daughter and to her heirs forever.
I give devise and bequeath unto my grand daughter Mary Davis my gilded
China plates, (and it is my will that she pay forty shillings out of the
money arising from the sales of the residue of my Estate in compensation
of the hire of a negro boy Peter which said gilded China plates I give unto
her my said grand daughter and her heirs for ever.
It is my will and desire that if my grand daughter Elizabeth Young should
not have sufficient of her father William Young deceased in estate to pay for
her name Henry, that then such deficiency be given her from

Will that at his decease the said looking glass shall
be sold and the money arising thereon divided among the children of my
son William as above mentioned.

I give devise and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Mary Godfrey Jackson my
largest China bowl to her my said Grand daughter and to her heirs forever.
I give devise and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Mary Davis my gilded
China plates, and it is my will that she paid forty shillings out of the
money arising from the Sales of the residue of my Estate in consideration
of the hire of a negro boy Peter which said gilded China plates I give unto
her my said Grand daughter and her heirs for ever.

It is my will and desire that if my Grand daughter Elizabeth Young should
not have sufficient of her father William Young deceased his Estate to pay for
a negro girl named Benny that then such deficiency be given her from
the Sales of the residue of my Estate not heretofore bequeathed.
I give and bequeath unto my said Grand daughter Elizabeth Young my and
horse called Trooper to her my said Grand daughter and her heirs forever.
I give devise and bequeath the remainder of my whole Estate whether Real
or personal to be equally divided among my six Grand children before

named ^{Rev} Rebecca Young the wife of Henry Young Junr. Williamson Elizabeth Williamson John and Godfrey to them and each of them my (and grand daughters, their heirs and each of their heirs forever.

I constituted and appointed my friends Henry Young junior & Williamson Young Junior Executors of this my last Will (and Testament.
