At a Court held for Essex County at Pappahannock on the 18th day of October 1790. This last will and Testament of Robert Clark being presented into Court by Margaret Clark the Executrix therein named was proved by John Montague and William Simco two of the witnesses thereto and also by the oath of the said Executrix and ordered to be recorded whereupon a Certificate was granted to the said Executrix in order to her obtaining probate thereof in due form.
