Expences shall be first paid and discharged. I then Give unto my son
Thomas Greenstead all my Estates, real and personal, except my old mare,
which mare I gave to Mary Greenstead now the wife of my Brother
John Greenstead. And in case my son Thomas Greenstead should die without
a lawful Issue, begotten of his body, then the whole Estate ^{which} I have given to
my son Thomas, to go to Phoebe Greenstead Daughter of my Brother John
Greenstead, to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body, forever,
and I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother John Greenstead
and John Whitlock, Executors, to this my last will and Testament, in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2^d day
