 Testament, in manner, and form, as followeth. I recommend first, I recommend my

 after the discretion of my Executor hereafter mentioned. Item; I give to
 my Nephews, Micajah Rutherford; and Jeremiah Rutherford, all my Cattle;
 and Household furniture, both of what was my own property, and also what my
 Brother John Spearman gave to me, of my heirs for ever, in his last will
 & Testament; to be equally divided between the said, Micajah, & Jeremiah
 Rutherford, to them and their heirs forever; with each and every individual
 thing that belongs to me, or in any wise appertains to my Estate, without
 appraising. Lastly, I constitute, and appoint my faithful friend Micajah Ruther-
 ford, Executor of this my last will, and Testament, in Testimony whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand, and seal this 22nd day of May 1784
