I Thomas Bouquard of Essex County who is very sick and weak in body but of perfect senses and memory do make this my last will and Testament, first I bequeath my soul to almighty God who gave it me and my body to be buried and as to what worldly goods I am possessed of I give as follows, I give unto my son Abadiak the Land I bought of John Prices Estate also four Negroes Named Gethroth, Tenor & Child & Micah to him and his heirs forever, I send unto my wife as long as she lives the Land that was my fathers, and at the death of her I send of Robert Beverly Esq. and at her death I give unto my son Philip and his heirs forever

two hundred acres of Land to be layed off joining the Land
that Ralph Pierce lives on that is to begin at Samuel
Nesbitts on Griffiths Douglass Land running parallel
with the South line to make that quantity, the remainder
of the above Land at the death of my wife, I give unto
my son Thomas and his heirs forever the buildings I
have begun on the Land I bought in of Charles Thornton
my desire is they should be finished by my executors to
paye for out of my Estate and the same together with
the Land be rented and the money so arising to sup-
port my wife and young Children until my son Da-
niel arrives to the age of twenty one years or Marrys at
which time I give the said Land and buildings unto
my son Daniel and his heirs forever, and if he shall

have no children now arrive to the age of twenty one years
I give the Land unto my Daughter Betty and her heirs
forever, the Lot I have at Laytons that was formerly, of
James Liguette my desire is it shall be put in repair &
by my executors and rented as long as my wife lives &
the money applied to the support of her (and my young
children and at her death I give the said Lot unto my
Son Thomas and his heirs forever, the Lot I bought of Capt.
John Rogers Estate, I give unto my son Philip to him &
his heirs forever, the two Lots that was James Hutchins &
company ^{this was given to me} I give unto my son Obadiah
to be paid out of
my estate twenty pounds p^r Year during my wifes live &
and the Minority of my children for his trouble of doing
business for them, I give unto my Daughter Rachel my

by my executors and rented as long as my wife lives &
the money applied to the support of her (and my young
children) and at her death I give the said lots unto my
son Thomas (and his heirs forever, the lot I bought of Capt.
John Rawlins Estate, I give unto my son Philip to him &
his heirs forever, the two lots that was James Pitches &
company ^{I his due paid and I give unto my son Obadiah} I give unto my son Obadiah, to be paid out of
my estate twenty pounds ^{per year} during my wife's lives &
and the Minority of my children for his trouble of doing
business for them, I give unto my Daughter Rachel my
Negro Girl named Sarah, the lot I have in Southwark
land my will is it shall be sold by my executors and

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the money arising from the sale go to discharge of Debts my
desire is that my estate be Invented at my death &
that my executors do sell twelve Months after so much of
the Estate that shall be Sufficient to pay my Just debts &
the remainder of my estate that have not all ready been given
or away be equally divided between my seven youngest
Children a division shall then take place so far as to ex-
cept the Children that is of lawfull age to receive there pro-
-portion and the part of the young Children remain to-
-gether and as any of them arrive to lawfull age or mari-
-age my will is they shall receive there proportion, if my
wife will not receive the allowance made her in this will
and have a dowry lay'd of, my desire is that such owners
of Negroes and Groceries at her death be equally divided as

of my goods and chattels at her death be equally divided amongst my seven youngest children, and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Obadiah Boulware, Ralph Boulware and John Hemshaw executors to this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Seventh day of March One thousand seven hundred and eighty five.
