

x In the name of God Amen: I Thomas Newbitt of
Essex bounty being sick and weak in Body but of sound mind and me-
mory, do make and ordain my last will and Testament, in manner
following.

- 1st I desire that my just Debts be fully paid and satisfied.
- 2nd I give to my son Henry Newbitt and his heirs forever, the land and plan-
tation whereon I now live, beginning at the mouth of the string branch, on
the Dragon swamp, thence up the meadows thence to the string, thence
a North easterly course to a new marked live oak, near the Church path,
thence along the path to the line of Newman of Brackenhough, thence along
the side of Brackenhoughs line, and the line of Henry Cutcher, to the Cro-
gan swamp, thence up the side of swamp to the beginning.
- 3rd I give to my son William Newbitt the land and plantation whereon he
now lives, to him and his heirs forever, bounded by the land of my son Henry
Newbitt, Newman of Brackenhough, my son Nath^l Newbitt and the Cro-
gan swamp.
- 4th I give to each of my Daughters Mary and Catherine Newbitt, one third the
Bills and furniture, the duty to have but half share over the same over the same.

7th I give to my Grand Children Thomas and Anne Newbill Children of my Son
Thomas Newbill and the sum of twenty five Pounds each to be paid them when
they arrive to Lawfull age or marry, which ever is first happen, or even when
should die before that period, the sum is to enjoy the whole, and when both
should die before they are entitled to receive their Legacies, then the same to turn
over in and be divided with my other estate as directed hereafter.

4th All my other Estate be it of what nature or kind soever, I give to be equally divided
among Children (Died) Henry Newbill, William Newbill, Margaret Catharine
Newbill, to them and their heirs forever; but in case either of my Daughters should
die without lawful issue, then I give the part of my Estate which may be allotted
her, to the survivor in like manner.

5th I appoint my dear Henry Newbill Executor of this my last will, hereby making
my all others before him before made. In Testimony whereof I have here
unto set my hand and affixed my seal, this third day of October in the
year of our Lord 1747.
