Just Debts (and the money arising from such sale to be Equally
divided between my seven Children. Lucy Boulware, Thomas Boul-
ware, Francis Boulware, Ora Boulware, Charles Boulware,
William Boulware (and) Sally Boulware, (and my will and aim
is that my land I now live on should be sold by my Executors here-
after mentioned for the most that can be got for it (and) the money
arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided between my seven
Children above named (and) lastly I appoint my son Francis
Boulware (and) Charles Boulware my whole (and) sole Executors to this my
last will (and) Testament in Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my-
hand (and) affixed my seal this 29th day of March 1791
