for whom, in the County of Essex being weak of body but ^{nevertheless} ~~much~~ ^{highly} praised by
God. Do make this my last will & Testament in manner following. First
my and desire is that my two Daughters, Susanna & Rhoda Brooke shall have
the use of my dwelling house to live in so long as it is convenient for them without
Interruption; & what rails I have by me to mend their house for them. I lend
the said tract of Land whereon I now live, including that I bought of Sib-
bins to my son Richard Brooke during his life, and after his death I
give it to his son Philip. I give also ^{to} my son Richard Brooke Thirty pounds
Cash. I give and bequeath to my ^{son} Philip Brooke my piece of Land bought
of Wethers adjoining the former, containing one hundred acres be it
more or less; and thirty pounds Cash. I give and bequeath to my grand sons
Isaac Brooke and his brother William Brooke my tract of Land adjoining
Moorlagues containing one hundred acres, be it more or less, to be equally
divided between them. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Patterson thirty pounds Cash.
I give to my two daughters Susanna & Rhoda each of them twenty pounds
Two cow & calves. Two Barrels Corn & butter to them. One feather bed. I give to
my grandson James Brooke thirty pounds. I give to my daughter Stan-
muth Allen thirty pounds Cash. I give to my grandson Isaac Philip Brooke
six pounds for Schooling. I give to my daughter Sarah one well and

more or less; And thirty pounds Cash I give and bequeath to my grand sons
Isaac Broocke and his brother William Broocke must tract of land adjoining M^r

divided between them. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Pullason thirty pounds
To my 3 daughters Joanna Crookell, Rhoda, each of them twenty pounds,

my grandson James Broocke thirty pounds I give to my daughter Man
-meh all her thirty pounds Cash I give to my 10 grandsons, Isaac, Philip, Broocke
Six pounds for Schooling them, Broughton, Early, my wife and
personal estate be sold by us, and all the Remainder of my estate after the
legacies paid off, be equally divided amongst all my Children now living,
I nominate and appoint, Andrew Allen, and my son Richard Broocke,
my executors, my last will & Testament empowering them to do and do what
be necessary to carry out fulfilling the same. Witness, whereof I have hereunto

seven hundred & twenty three

and County of Essex do make and ordain this my last will & Testament in manner and form
as followeth I lend to my beloved wife Elizabeth Dunn all my estate during her life & at
her death to be disposed of as I shall hereafter Direct. I bequeath I give my plantation
to be equally divided amongst my three sons Benjamin Dunn, Daniel Dunn and
Anthony Brown Dunn to have and their heirs forever. Item I give to my son Philip Dunn twenty
shillings Sterling to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son Benjamin Dunn my
bigged Iron pot one feather bed & a mantle & one cow to him and his heirs forever
I give to my son Benjamin Dunn one cow and one Iron pot to him & his heirs forever

Item
