this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. Item
I bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary Greenwood all my estate Real ^{and} ^{and at her marriage or death} ^{and}
personal unto her marriage or death, to be divided amongst my children
as I shall direct. Item I give my title between my son Toyman Greenwood
and my son William Greenwood to them and their heirs forever. Item I give
my son Toyman Greenwood the land and plantation whereon I now
live to him ^{and} his heirs forever. Item I give to my son William Greenwood
the land and plantation that I purchased of James Granville to him ^{and}
his heirs forever. Item I bequeath to my daughter Mary Jaffer one fifth part
of the rest of my estate that I have not been already given both real ^{and}
personal during her Natural life, and at her death to be equally divided
amongst her surviving children. Item all the rest of my Estate both real ^{and} ^{and}
personal I give to be equally divided amongst my four daughters, Rachel Mary, Mary
Fiske Francis Benson ^{and} Prudence Melling but my wife and mine is that

if either of them should see without have lawfully signed of their own
their part of my name should be used amongst friends of my living
my Daughter or their surviving heirs, that my last will and Testament
my son Benjamin Greenwood my wife Mary Greenwood and James Green-
wood my whole and sole Executors to this my last will and Testament

Milly Dean the witnesses thereto and also by the Oath of the said Exec-
utrix the same was ordered to be recorded, Whereupon a Certificate

June 1791 This last will and Testament of William Greenwood deceased
being presented into Court by Charles Greenwood the executor thereof
named and proved by the Oaths of Ben Johnson, Elizabeth Dean and
Milley Dean the Witnesses thereto and also by the Oath of the said Exe-
cutor the same was agreed to be recorded. Whereupon a Certificate
was granted to the said Executor in view to his obtaining probate of
the said Testament in due form none being objected according to law.
