gros Aggy Sance and Judy to her and her heirs forever, Item I
give to my daughter Elizabeth Thomas three negros, Isaac, Natty
and Henry and one feather bed and furniture to her and
her heirs forever, Item I lend to my friend Elizabeth Covington
two negros Bob and Sarah and one feather bed and fur-
niture and laymace and Saddle during her life and my
Will and devise is that she shall continue on the planta-
tion I gave my son Lewis and that he shall work her negros
and maintain her during her life, Old Gher I let free to continue
on the land, with Lewis Thomas, My will and devise is that the
remainder part of my estate shall be sold and equally divid-
ed among my above named children, Lastly I appoint my
Sons Lewis James and Edmund Thomas Executors to this my
last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 18th day of June one thousand se-
ven hundred and ninety
