human life. & while in a sound state of mind. make & contain this my last Will and
Testament in manner following. I do most humbly recommend my soul to the extensive
Mercy of that Eternal Supreme. Intelligent being who gave it me most earnestly at the same
time deprecating his justice. My body I desire to be interred at the Discretion of my Execu-
tors to be hereafter named. not doubting of a Resurrection. I Will & Positively Order
that my Debt be paid. And then I Give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Young during her natural life the
Land whereon I now live together with the negroes following VIZ. Doves, ^{Jack} Doves, Robin, Aggar.
Joan & Jane my riding ^{horses} & harness my Bay mare called Polly. ten Choice Sheep. two cows
& their calves & four Oxen. all my ^{silver} ~~silver~~ ^{china} plates. Dishes. Cups & Saucers my Bed with my
large bible my whole stock of man & ^{some} ~~there~~ part of all my household furniture & my Silver Watch.
I Give devise & bequeath unto my Daughter Emily / now the wife of Leroy Dargersfield / One negro Girl
named Polly with her future increase to her my said Daughter & to her heirs forever. I Give devise
& bequeath unto my Daughter Ann / now the wife of Hyman Belfield / one negro Girl named
Lucy with her future Increase to her my said Daughter & to her heirs forever. I Give devise &
bequeath unto my Daughter Mary / now the wife of Elliott Hurman / one negro Girl named Hannah
& One good Cow / to make up her Lot of equal value / with their future increase to her my said

I named Polly with her future increase to her my said Daughter & to her heirs forever I give & devise
I bequeath unto my Daughter Ann / now the wife of Hyman Belfield / one negro Girl named
Lizzy with her future Increase to her my said Daughter & to her heirs forever I give & devise I
bequeath unto my Daughter Mary / now the wife of Eliot Humman / one negro Girl named Hannah
& one good slave / to make up her Lot of equal value / with their future increase to her my said
Daughter & to her heirs forever — I give & devise I bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Smith young
one negro Girl named Betty & one good slave / to make up her Lot of equal value / with their
future increases to her my said Daughter & to her heirs forever — I give unto my Grandson William
Daingerfield a negro boy named Will or Butty my Gun & my young mare Colt called Lucy Locket
with her future increase to him my said Grandson & to his heirs forever — I give unto my Grandson
Gerrin Daingerfield my Silver watch after the death of his Grand mother Elizabeth Young to him
my said Grandson & to his heirs forever — I give & devise I bequeath the Remainder of my whole estate
whether real or personal to be equally divided among my four Daughters Wm. Lacy the wife of
Leroy Daingerfield Ann the wife of Hyman Belfield Mary the wife of Eliot Humman & Elizabeth
Smith Young: my Daughter Lizzy to be charged with such part as she hath already received as
will appear by my book / Page 43 / and my Daughter Mary to be also charged with such part
as she hath already received as will appear by my said book / Page 70 / to them & each of
them my said Daughters their heirs & each of their heirs forever — I give & devise that at the death
of my wife Elizabeth Young the land negroes & all other Articles that may be left which I

have lent to her During her natural Life to be Sold at the Discretion of my Executors (to be hereafter named) and the money arising from such Sale I gave unto my four Daughters Viz: Lucy Ann Mary & Elizabeth Smith, to be equally divided among them so that each of them my said Daughters their Heirs & each of their Heirs forever. I will order that the accounts between myself & Son in Law be first settled & the Balance if any due each or either of them be first paid before any other of my Debt. or before the Division of my Estate. I constitute & appoint my beloved wife, ^{Elizabeth} executrix & my three Sons in Law Viz: Leroy Wainwright, Lyman Belfield & Elliot Sturman Executors of this my last Will & Testament.
