

This Indenture made this 22th Day of February in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy four Between the Vestry of Truro Parish in the County of Cornwall of the one part & John Manley Son & Heir of Harrison Manley Dec. late of the said Parish & County of the other part; Whereas the said Vestry did on the 5th Day of June in the Year 1772 Order sundry Pews in the New Church on the upper Side of which to be sold at the laying of the Next parish Levy, to the Highest bidder; for the benefit of the Parish; Pursuant to which order the said Pews were sold accordingly by the Vestry at the laying of the said Next parish Levy on the 2nd Day of November in the same Year and the said Harrison Manley dec. then purchased one certain Pew in the said Church for the price of fifteen pounds Ten Shillings Current Money to wit the Pew Numbered 30 Situate between the two long Isles and adjoining the North Wall & the Loop Hole as by the proceedings and records of the said Vestry reference being thereunto had, may more fully and at large appear; And Whereas the said Harrison Manley hath since (departed this life without having made any disposition of the said Pew. Now This Indenture Witnesseth that the said Vestry for and in consideration of the said sum of fifteen pounds Ten Shillings Current Money to them in hand paid for the use of the said parish by the said John Manley Son & Heir to the said Harrison Manley before the dealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged have granted Bargained and sold Alien and confirmed and by these presents do grant Bargain and sell Alien and confirm unto the said John Manley Son & Heir of Harrison Manley dec. the said Pew in the said New Church lately Built on the upper Side of which in the said parish of Truro & County aforesaid. Numbered and Situated as above mentioned To Have and to hold the said Pew above described unto the said John Manley Son & Heir of Harrison Manley dec. his Heirs & Assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said John Manley Son & Heir of Harrison Manley dec. his Heirs and Assigns forever And the said Vestry for themselves and their successors (Vestry Men of Truro Parish) do covenant and grant to & with the said John Manley Son & Heir of Harrison Manley dec. his Heirs and Assigns that he the said John Manley Son & Heir of Harrison Manley dec. his Heirs and Assigns shall may forever hereafter peaceably & quietly have hold and enjoy the said Pew above mentioned and described without the lawfull let Hindrance Interruption or Molestation of any Person or Persons whatsoever.
