Item I give and bequeath to my eldest son William Bironaugh six
silver spoons with which I hope he will be content as he is already &
better provided for than any of my other Children by having inherited
his Fathers Lands & Slaves

Item I give & bequeath to my son John Bironaugh to him & his
heirs for ever all that tract or parcel of Land upon the Branches of
Accotinch and Dodge Run which was bequeathed to me by the Last
will & Testament of my Father Coll^l George Mason deced being the
Moety of my said Father's part of a Patent granted to him and James
Beresford

Item I give & bequeath to my said son John Bironaugh one negroe man &
named Sam which I lately bought of my Daughter Elizabeth and also
the sum of Fifty pounds each part of the money which I have in the
hands of M^r Thompson Mason also six silver spoons & two horses
named Jack & Diamond

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Bironaugh a white &
horse named Smoaker Item I give to my Daughter Ann &
(Bironaugh)

Bronaugh the sum of Five pounds she having been & provided for in the Life time of her Father

Now my will is that all the Remaining part of my personal Estate be Equally divided between my Daughters Mary & Elizabeth Bronaugh Lastly Revoking all others I appoint my Nephew Mr. George Mason Executor of this my Last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Affixed my seal this 13th day of February in the year 1701.
