 that she may remove to James River or on any part of my
 Estate that she may choose to live at during her life in
 I desire the debts owing me may be got in as fast as possible

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The Judgements I have in hand against William Roe and
also that William Grayson discount eight pound ten for four
years service of the Barber for fear it might be forgot. ⁱⁿ ^{and}
and now after ^{having} been so particular in my affairs altogether which
from the large Extensive bargains heretofore concerned in it
appears necessary to ^{be} understood in this plain manner and af-

 my child Thomas Hubbard a lot of land in the town of
 White and desire my son will give him sufficient schooling
 for the good opinion I have of his father and mother &c. Item
 I give to my dear and intimate friend M.^r Richard Thompson
 of George Town in the State of Maryland and to his heirs
 for ever all the lower part of the Land I purchased of Edward
 Ball and wife where on ^{his} mill stands from the lower end
 of the tract up the river to the beginning of the first low grounds

Or end of the steep hills adjoining the Land of Colonel Murdock
and free from any encumbrances including the arearage of Rent due on
the condemned Lands of the said mill and I do hereby Appoint the
said Thompson collector of all my subscriptions so justly ^{due} to me
and Acknowledged by the Committee of Maryland and Virginia
for the great pains and trouble I have been at Exclusive of the Extra
ordinary expences after digging in Virginia with so many workmen
where said subscriptions yet due and when collected will not be
sufficient to reimburse me the said Expences alone
I cannot forget mentioning some matters concerning Blackburn &
Elzey but it might be looked over and it is my Express desire that
they both may be called to a just settlement as soon as possible for
every part of their management and conduct about my Estate
which in their Possession and that they may be accountable for
all deficiency of tobacco and Extraordinary Charges, who they sold
the tobacco to and what price they received for it which may
be known by the Inspectors books that from their brutal and Inhu
man treatment to my person under the greatest affection is
sufficient to prove ^{that} they would not hesitate to do me every prejudice
in their power and therefore I suspect them in all their Accounts
I never being so confused and jumbled together without proper
dates vouchers so necessary in such considerable Transactions

I suspect Mr. Elzeyin charging himself with three or four years
crop of Tobacco at a very low price and not mentioning the persons names
to whom he sold the Tobacco, and the price, as some may have given more
than the low price he charges him self also that he hath taken advan-
tage in buying up my old debts with my own money at a less value
and charging me with the whole amount of debt and costs witness James
Kelly charging in his old account which requires a strict examination
throughout the whole of his Charges and Transactions, In order to have
this examination properly done to the satisfaction of both parties I
desire and request my dear friends, W. Alexander Henderson
and Mr. Hector Hopme Allen the said Settlement who are the
best acquainted with these affairs and all other matters that may
arise in dispute after my death, to meet me, I give to my three
before mentioned friends each a morning ring of the value of
two guineas as a remembrance of the many happy days passed
together on Occoquon St. and lastly I do hereby nominate and
constitute and appoint my dear sister Frances Walendine and my
said loving son Thomas William Walendine Executors and Exculors
of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making
void any forme or other will by me heretofore made declaring this
