I Will - George Duncan of the Town of Alexandria and State of Virginia  
being on my perfect senses and sound memory blessed be the God for it, do this  
the twentieth day of August in the year one thousand seven hundred and  
Eighty two, make and publish this my last Will and Testament in the  
manner following, that is to say, first I give and bequeath to my son George G.  
Duncan the House and lot whereon I now live in the said Town of Alexandria  
on Royal Street containing twenty four feet front and one hundred and  
twenty three feet six inches back, lying between Adams Lynn's lot and

*Richard Clark. Also I give to my son Robert*

Duncan and my Daughter Rebeccah all my negroes that shall then be belonging  
to my Estate when they shall come of age also one tract or parcel or tracts  
or parcels of land I hold now by warrant in Kentucky Settlement contain-  
ing one thousand acres to be equally divided in the following manner &  
That when Robert comes of age the land shall be valued by the Executors or  
Persons appointed by them and likewise the negroes shall also be valued, but if  
the land should not appear to them to be of as much value as the negroes the  
difference shall be made up out of the negroes given to my son Robert but if  
the land in Kentucky should appear to them to be of more value than the  
negroes then he the said Robert shall have the same without having any  
part of the same taken off to make up the difference thereof, but he and Robert  
shall have the whole of the Land and my Daughter Rebeccah shall have the  
whole of the negroes belonging to my Estate when she comes of age and it is  
further my Will and desire that after all my just debts are paid, that my son  
George Duncan shall have all my furniture and all debts due me, and everything  
Due whatever not before mentioned, that shall be me belong, and I do give and  
bequeath the same to him, But it is my will and desire that the profits of the whole  
of my Estate shall be laid out in such manner for my three children, as for them  
to be well and sufficiently Schooled, and then put to trades businesses or employ-  
ments as it shall appear best to the Executors of this my Will and Testament &  
All I do make my worthy and honest friends Mr William Hartsho  
Mr Peter Wise and my Brother Charles Duncan as Executors of my Estate to take  
care and see the same performed according to the true intent and meaning &
