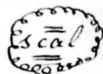

I James Parsons of the Town of Alexandria County of Fairfax and Commonwealth of Virginia, being sick and weak of body, but of sound mind and memory, calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and desirous that after my death, my Estate shall pass to my wife and Children in a manner different from that which is directed by our laws, where the proprietor dies intestate, do make this my last Will and Testament.

Imprimis, I resign my soul to Almighty God, to be disposed of by him according to his Sovereign Will. My body I desire may be decently buried.

Item, I desire that all my just debts, may be paid by my hereinafter named

Executors. *Item* it is my desire, that my said Executors do out of my
 Estate erect and enclose the house begun by me adjoining the house wherein
 Edward Sanford now lives, and should the debts due me be insufficient for that
 purpose, I hereby empower them and the survivor and survivors of them to sell so

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this tenth day of September in the Year One Thousand seven hundred & Eighty three.

Imprimis whereas I have in and by my said Will devised a Negro woman named Dinah and her future increase unto my loving wife — Mary & upon Reflection finding that it will be more to the Interest of my said wife to give her another Woman in Room of the said Dinah, I do therefore give and devise this Negro Woman Steeny and her future increase unto my said wife during her natural life with power and authority to dispose

Of her and her future increase in the same manner as by my said Will she is empowered to dispose of the other Slaves given her and in case of her neglecting to make such disposition I do hereby give and devise the said Negro Slave Henry and her increase to go and be divided in the same manner as the other Slaves devised to my said ^{wife} are directed by my said Will directed to be disposed off in case of my said wifes dying without making any disposition of them and the said Dinah & her increase I direct to go into the Common Stock.....

Item I give and devise unto my daughter Ann Adams and to her Heirs and Assigns for ever the two Negro Girls Lucy & Dinah and their future increase who were by my said Will given unto her untill her two daughters should arrive to the age of Twenty One Years I also give unto my said daughter and her Heirs a Negro boy named Davy who was by my said Will given to my daughter Elizabeth who since the making thereof hath departed this life unmarried and the other Negro named Mimia given to my said daughter Elizabeth I direct to go into and be considered as a part of the common Stock. Item. I give and devise unto Frances Beelen a good horse saddle and bridle of not less value than fifteen pounds current money.

Item I give and devise unto my friend William Aunth Jun^r a general mourning Ring which I direct my Executors to provide and present him with as a Testimonial of my regard for him. Item it is my Will and desire that there be no division made in my Estate among my Children untill the Month of December 1785 In Witness whereof I have to this Codicil set my hand and Seal the 11th day of November 1784. ---
