 & demands & rights & property whatsoever I give to sell beloved wife
 Ellenor during her widowhood accounting it so long as her
 keeping from marring or having a child by any man upon these
 terms it is to be held as long as she lives & as to my dear mother
 that brought me into this world she is to have a maintenance
 for her estate that was left by her husband which was in Will-
 iam & Richard Kents hands therefore I desire that the estate
 that has been received in our hands that there be men choiced to
 divide it equally between them & then if mother is uneasy that
 they give their bond & security such as she thinks proper and as to
