 the following my last Will & Testament.
 I Imprintes I give and devise unto my dear wife

 Item I give and bequeath after my said wifes death the said
 Tract of Land called Montpelier unto my two daughters
 Elizabeth and Antitholem Sebastian and their heirs forever
 to be equally divided between them and their heirs.
 Item I do will and Devise that my Tract of Land lying
 in the County of Loudoun containing three hundred and
 fifty Acres more or less shall be sold in fee simple by my friends
 Thomas Lewis and John Wops of the same County for the
 payment of my just Debts whom I constitute and appoint
 my Exors for that purpose and for all other matters & things
 concerning & respecting me in the County of Loudoun.

Now I do will and devise that my tract of Land lying in Fairfax County containing one hundred & fifty Acres more or less which I purchased of Blanche Duncan and Leticia his wife shall be sold in fee simple for the payments of my just debts by my friends Thomas Wren and William Wren whom I constitute and appoint my Agents for that purpose and of all other matters and things concerning or respecting me every where except in the said County of Loudoun.
