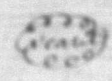

of my Executors. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Williamson
a two year old horse, and one spinning wheel. Item I give and bequeath to my
son James Williamson Benjamin Williamson & William Williamson one dollar
a piece Item I give and bequeath to my Daughters Marthens Williamson and
Elizabeth Williamson a dwelling a piece. Item I give and bequeath to my loving
wife Rachel Williamson and my son Nathan Williamson all my estate to be
equally divided between the two to them & their heirs forever Lastly it is my sense
that my son Nathan Williamson should be my whole and sole Executor of this my
last will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
