I resign my soul into the hands of my Almighty Creator chearfully confiding in the wisdom and Mercy of his Disposition: and my Body I desire may be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors: and as for all the worldly Estate with which it hath pleased God to bless me. I dispose of the same in manner and form following.

I institute and devise unto my dear wife Penelope for and during her natural life my mansion House and dwelling plantation with all the Lands thereunto belonging and adjoining. That is to say all my land in Mathew's patent also a Tract of Land taken up and partitioned by my Deceased Father: and two Tracts of Land I purchased one of Nicholas Ragon the other of Edward Slackburn likewise give and devise unto my said wife for and during her natural life all my lands upon and above the Mouth of the Piques Creek which I purchased of the Executors of Richard Osborn Dec'd of the Executors of Doctor Arbutnot dec'd. and of John Manley dec'd. and

Hm I give and bequeath unto my dear wife Penelope for and during her natural life the use of all my Slaves belonging to all or any of the above mentioned Lands and now residing and living theron together with the use in like manner of all my Hocks of Horses cattle Sheep and Hogs Plantation Utensils and Household &c Furniture and in general every thing in my said Mansion House and upon the before mentioned Tracts of Land Except two Mulattoes one a lad named Dick and the other a young Woman named Nan: to whom I have already given their discharge and Freedom under my hand and seal: and it is my will and particular desire that the said two Mulattoes named Dick and Nan do for ever enjoy their Freedom accordingly.

Hm I desire my friend Colonel George Mason to accept of the sum of Fifty pounds as a small testimony of my regard for him.

Hm I give and bequeath unto Mr. Hugh French who now lives with me the sum Fifty pounds.

Hm I give and bequeath unto my neice Mrs. Sarah Tiptlett the wife of Mr. Thomas Tiptlett and to her heirs forever a negro Boy named Jack now at Mr. Humphrey Peake.

Hm I give and devise unto my Wifes Brother Mr. Harrison Manley and his heirs for ever all the Slaves and other Estate whatsoever now in the possession of his Mother Mrs. Manley to which which I now have or may upon the Death of the said Mrs. Manley have have any Right or title.

Hm it is my will and Desire and I hereby authorise and direct my Executors to purchase with the first profits of my Estate two Slaves for my Brother in law Mr. Townsend Pace which two Slaves to be so purchased I give and bequeath unto my said Brother Mr. Townsend Pace and his heirs forever.

And whereas I am at this time ingaged as an undertaker in Building a church for this parish it is my will and desire that the said church be built & completed according to my articles of agreement with the Vestry of the said Parish and that the Money due to me from the said Vestry be from time to time properly applyed to that purpose.

Hm I give and bequeath my wearing apparel unto John French who formerly lived at my Quarter in London.

Hm I give and bequeath my silver Watch to my Nephew Mr. French Brother.

Hm I give and bequeath unto William Spencer the sum of forty Shillings a year during his life to be laid out for him every year in Clothes by my Executors.

Hence I give and devise unto my only Daughter Elizabeth and to her heirs for ever all my Lands in the County of Prince William Fairfax and Loudon together with all my Slaves and Stocks and all other my real and personal Estate whatsoever not herein before otherwise disposed of and all the lands and slaves and other Estate which I have herein before devised unto my wife for and during the term of her natural life only I do also —— give and devise unto my said Daughter Elizabeth and her heirs for ever after my said Wife's decease. —
