I give and devise unto my dear Wife Penelope for and during her natural Life my mansion House and dwelling plantation with all the Lands therunto belonging and adjoining, that is to say all my land in Matthews's patent, also a Tract of Land taken up and patented by my deceased Father, and two Tracts of Land purchased one of Nicholas Nagan the Officer of Edward Slackburn likewise give and devise unto my said Wife for and during her natural life all my lands upon and above the Mouth of Poquos Creek which I purchased of the Executors of Richard Osborn Decd. of the Executors of Doctor Ambrose decd. and of John Manley decd. and

Item I give and bequeath unto my niece Mrs. Sarah Tipton the wife of Mr. Thomas Tipton and to her heirs for ever a negro Boy named Jack now at Mr. Humphrey Prakes.

Item I give and devise unto my Wifes Brother Mr. Harrison Manley and his heirs for ever all the Slaves and other Estate whatsoever now in the possession of his Mother Mrs. Manley to which ~~which~~ I now have or may upon the Death of the said Mrs. Manley have any Right or title.

Item it is my will and Desire and thereby authorize and direct my Executors to purchase with the first profits of my Estate two Slaves for my Brother in law Mr. Townsend (Page) which two Slaves he so purchased I give and bequeath unto my said Brother Mr. Townsend (Page) and his heirs for ever.

And whereas I am at this time engaged as an undertaker in Building a Church for two parish it is my will and desire that the said Church be built & completed accordingly to my articles of agreement with the Vestry of the said Parish and that the Money due to me from the said Vestry be from time to time properly applied to that purpose.

Item I give and bequeath my wearing apparel unto John French who formerly lived at my Quarters in Louisa.

Item I give and bequeath my silver Watch to my Nephew Mr. French Strother.

Item I give and bequeath unto William Spencer the sum of forty Shillings a year during his life to be laid out for him Every year in Clothes by my Executors.
