weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same do make and  
execute this my last will & Testament in manner & form following. In witness whereof I commend my  
soul into the hands of Almighty God trusting in the merits of my saviour to obtain  
forgiveness of all my sins & my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion

of my Executore hereafter named and as for my temporal estate I give and dispose of the same in manner following

Item. I give unto my living wife Mary Mackson the use of three negroes vizt. Will, George & Sarah her feather bed and furniture & the rest of my household goods except what is hereafter mentioned & the third part of my stock of Cattle, Horses, Hogs, sheep &c during her natural life, and after her decease to equally divide among her children by me lawfully begotten

Item. I give & bequeath to my son Edward Mackson a negro lad called Tom one feather bed, two cows & calves six head of sheep which he is now possessed of to him and his heirs forever

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Lindsey a negro girl called Anna which she is now possessed of to her & her heirs forever

Item. I give and bequeath to my son William Mackson five hundred pounds current or one thousand pounds of Cred Robates to be paid by my Executore when he will

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Robert Mackson a negro boy called Jim whom and his heirs for ever

Item. it is my will that negro Doso, Jack & Rose and their increase be kept for the benefit of my younger children vizt. Sarah, Elizabeth, John, Thomas & Richard for eight years & at the Expiration of the said term that the said negroes and their increase be equally divided among the said younger children to them & their heirs forever And if it should happen that any of the said younger children should die before the Expiration of the said eight years my will is that the said negroes & their increase be equally divided amongst the said surviving younger children to them & their heirs forever

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah one feather bed & furniture to be delivered to her at the Day of Marriage or at the age of eighteen years over and above her part of the said three negroes and their increase

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one feather bed and furniture to be delivered in manner as aforesaid over and above her part of the said three negroes and their increase

Item. my will is that my negro woman called Lemon and her child Phoebe be sold and that twenty pounds currency of the money arising from the sale of the said

Negro woman and child be paid Abraham Tatum for a tract of land containing four hundred and eighteen acres which I have purchased of him, and that the overplus of the money arising from the said sale be applied towards discharging my debts.

Item, my will is that my loving wife Mary Maseron have the use & benefit of the said tract of land during her natural life and after her decease to descend to my two sons John and Thomas Maseron to be equally divided to them & their heirs forever.

Item, In case that either of my said sons John and Thomas should die without heirs & lawfully begotten that his part of the said land shall descend to my son Richard and his heirs forever, and in case my said son Richard or the survivor of my said sons John and Thomas should die without heirs my will is that his & their part of the said land should descend to my son Robert Maseron and his heirs for ever.

Item, my will is that a pair of truffles now lying in my pocket be sold to raise money to discharge my debts. And I hereby appoint my loving wife Mary Maseron & my son Edward Maseron executors of this my last will & testament utterly revoking and & renouncing all former wills by me made.
