 I Benoni Kent of Fairfax County an Parish of Stur^r Plaster being Sick and weak in Body
 but of perfect mind and Memory thank be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the mortal-
 ity of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die do make and or-
 der this my Last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give
 and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recom-
 mend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the Discre-
 tion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive
 the same again by the Mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wher-
 with it hath pleased God to Bless me in this life I give devise and Dispose of the
 same in the Following manner and form
 I Impower I give and Bequeath to Jean my Dearly Beloved wife the one third
 part of my Estate to Her freely to be enjoyed

Item I give and Bequeath to my Beloved Daughter Ann Larace two Cows and two Calves with the other
 things I formerly lent her, my will is that the Remainder part of my Estate be Equally Divided between
 my other Ten Children Viz John, Samuel, Daniel, Thomas, Sampson, and Peter, Susanna, Mary, Sarah
 and Elizabeth
 But if my Daughter Mary should Die without an heir my Devise is that her part of my Estate be divided Equally
 amongst my other Nine Children
 my will and Devise is that my Son shall be for their heirs at the age of eighteen years if my wife should think
 proper so marry; my will is that my Estate be Divided at the appraisement as above mentioned
 Lastly I Nominate constitute make and adjoin my Beloved Son John Kent my only and sole Executor of this
 my Last Will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disavow Revoke and Disannul all and every other
 former Testaments Wills and Legacies Bequests and Executions by me in any ways before this time named
 Willed and Bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my Last will and Testament
