I Benoni Kent of Fairfax County an Slave of Lucy Hunter being sick and weak in Body
but of perfect mind and Memory thank^s to be given unto god therefore calling unto mind the mortal-
ity of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and or-
= dain this my Last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give
and Recommend my Soul into the hands of god that gave it and for my Body I recom-
mend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the pleasure
of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the Mighty Power of god and as touching such worldly Estate where-
withal it hath pleased god to Bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the
same in the following manner and form
Imprimis I give and Bequeath to Jean my Dearly Beloved wife the one third
part of my Estate to her freely to be enjoyed

Item I give and Bequeath to my Beloved Daughter Ann Caracoe two Cows and two Calves with the other
Things I formerly lent her, My will is that the Remainder part of my Estate be Equally Devide between
my other Seven Children viz John, Samuel, Daniel, Thomas, Sampson, and Peter, Susanna, Mary, Sarah
and Elizabeth

But if my Daughter Mary Should Die without an heir my Desire is that her part of my Estate be devide equally
amongst my other Nine Children

my will and Desire is that my Son shall be for their Slave at the age of eighteen years if my wife Should think
proper to marry, my will is that my Estate be Devide at the Appraisement as above mentioned

Lastly I nominate Constitute make and return my Beloved Son John Kent my only and sole Executor of this
my Last Will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disavow and Disannul all and every other
Former Testaments Wills and Legacies Requests and Executors by me in any ways before this time named
Witnessed Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last will and Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day and year above written
