Silver Tea Pongo — I Give all my Books and Lanthorn room to be equally Divided between Sarah McCormack and Amelia Watson — I Appoint my Friend George McCormack my Executor to this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have Hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 23rd Day of Feb^y 1773
