In the Name of God Amen I Joshua Ferguson of the County of Fairfax & Parish of Truro being sick & weak of Body blessed be God of perfect sense & memory do ordain & appoint this my last Will & Testament: & first I do give & recommend with sincere hope my soul to God & my Body to be decently buried by my Executors hereafter mentioned. Item it is my Will & Desire that at all my just debts be paid & that then the whole residue of my Estate be equally divided amongst all my children Vizt^o John Ferguson, Ann Ferguson, Judey Ferguson, Joshua Ferguson, Mary Ferguson, Joseph Ferguson, Elizabeth Ferguson William Ferguson & the child that my loving wife Mary Ferguson is big with in manner following, that is to say that my son John Ferguson do receive one half of his proportionable part so soon as a division can be made after my death & the other half to remain in the hands of my loving wife Mary Ferguson so long as she shall remain a widow & no longer. And that my above named & expressed children do receive one half of their proportionable parts so soon as they shall be of full age & the other part to remain in the hands of my loving wife Mary Ferguson so long as she shall remain a widow & no longer but then to be delivered up to my above named children. Item it is my Will & desire that if any of my above named children should die before they should arrive to full age that then it is my Will & desire that their proportionable parts be equally divided amongst my surviving children.

Item my Will & Desire that my loving Friends William Stone James Moore, & Mercellus Littlejohn do alot & equally divide my whole Estate among my children & do appoint my loving wife Mary Ferguson & my loving son John Ferguson my sole & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament.
