In the name of God amen I Thomas Wren of the County of Fairfax & Parish aforesaid being sick & weak of body, but of perfect sense & memory thanks be to Almighty God for it, & calling to mind the frailty of my body, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die so make this my last will & Testament in manner & form following Viz^t

First & principally I committ my Soul to Almighty God my body to the Earth there to be buried according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned.

Secondly, all my debts lawfully contracted may be honestly & justly paid then what worldly goods it has pleased God to bless me with I dispose of in manner & form following

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Nicholas Wren ten shillings current money, he having had his full part before.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my loving son William Wren, the Lease of land whereon I now live & two negroes named Dick & Sam, after his mother's death to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my loving son John Wren, one negroe boy named Daniel a mother's death to him & his heirs forever.

Leach the other witness to the said Will (who is since dead) subscribe the same as a Witness thereto at the request and in the presence of the said Testatrix and the said Testatrix having first declared to the said Jane Leach that the same was her last Will & Testament and being at the same time of sound and disposing mind and memory and the said Executor having performed what is usual in such cases Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.
