the said Marys Life; Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert the
house whereon I now live, and nine hundred and four Acres adjoining to
it to him and his heirs forever; Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert
eight hundred and sixty three Acres lying in Frederick County, to him and
his heirs forever; Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert two tracts
of Land one lying in Loudoun, containing five hundred and forty Acres,
the other in Fairfax County containing four hundred and thirty nine Acres,
to him and his heirs for ever, which were settled in Lieu of a tract of Land
whereon I now live; Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert ten
Negroes, vizt Robin, Abie, Will, Nan, David, Will, Hilley, Rose, //
Solomon, and James, to him and his heirs; Item I give and bequeath unto
my Son Philip nine hundred and four Acres of Land to him and his heirs
for ever which were formerly leased to one Robert Osborn, with the Island
therein included, known by the name of Homes Island; Item I give and bequeath
unto my said Son Philip and his heirs, for ever, the houses and Lotts in the
town of Alexandria after the decease of my loving Wife; Item I give and bequeath
unto my Son George, and his heirs for ever, that tract of Land which I
purchased of Thomas Smith, containing five hundred and ninety four Acres

Also another tract which I bought of Benjamin Sebastian, containing four hundred and thirty Acres to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Garrard and to his heirs nine hundred Acres of the upper part of the tract of Land whereon I now live. Also another tract of Land lying in Frederick County containing four hundred and seventy Acres Contiguous to a Brick house which I purchased of John Harden to him and to his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter - Nancy a Negro girl named Peg and her increase daughter of a Negro Man called Kell, to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my said Daughter - Nancy five hundred pounds currency, to be paid to her at the day of Marriage with Interest thereon for her Maintenance, to be raised out of the profits of my Estate. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter - Mary Ann and he has a Negro girl called Peg, and her Increase, Daughter of Bessa housewife. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter - Mary Ann five hundred pounds currency to be paid at the day of Marriage with Interest thereon for her maintenance to be raised out of the profits of my Estate. Item my Will and Desire is that all my Negroes (except those already bequeathed) be equally divided between my three sons Philip, George and Garrard, and their heirs forever. Item I do desire that all the rest and residue of my Estate both real and personal be equally divided between my four sons Robert, Philip, George, and Garrard, and their heirs forever. Item my Will and Desire is that my Son Philip have liberty to build houses on the said Lots and houses in the Life time of the said Mary for his own benefit so as not to discommode those already built. Item I do constitute appoint and ordain my Loving wife and my Son Robert and Philip Executors of this my last will and Testament, revoking all others heretofore made. In Witness whereof I the said Garrard Alexander have to this my Last Will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and Year above written. Signed Sealed and delivered by
