In the name of God amen I George Nicholas black
Smith of the County of Fairfax in the Colony of Virginia
being sick and weak of body but of sound mind & memory
calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal Life and
that it is appointed to all men once to die do make my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following
In presence I give and bequeath my soul to God and ^{my} body to
the Earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
according to the direction of my Executors hereafter men-
tioned not doubting but humbly hoping for a joyfull resurrec-
tion to Eternal life thro the merits and intercession of Jesus
Christ my Saviour and as for the portion of worldly Goods it
hath pleased God to endow with I Will and ordain that all
my debts Funeral Charges should be paid and that all my
Children Viz^t Frederick, George, Gerrard, John, Rachel
Lewis Katherine and Valentine should live with their

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Mother Mary my dearly beloved wife untill they shall respectively arrive at the age appointed by the Laws of this Colony Viz. twenty one years for the male Children and eighteen for the Females if Mary my said wife shall be able to keep them in an honest and decent manner but if it should happen that any of my said Children shall prove undutiful or disobedient to their mother or she should be unable or unwilling to keep them in the manner aforesaid then my will and desire is that my Executors or the survivor of them should bind such Child or Children to learn some good trade untill they shall arrive at age

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary my bald Eagle Mare and her English Colt if so much shall remain of my Estate after my Debt and Funeral Charges shall be paid and also to my said wife Mary I leave my smiths Tools on purpose that such of my sons as chooses to learn the smiths trade while under age may have the use of the said Tools but if any of my said sons proves disobedient to their Mother and refuses to live with or work for her that she may be enabled to raise such of my other Children as may be unable to support themselves then such disobedient son shall have no benefit arising from the said Tools

Item my will is that at the marriage or death of my said wife whatever goods or money out vancing Debts or any other Estate shall belong to my said wife or Children before such marriage or death shall be equally divided among my said Children or the survivors of them

Item my son Michael shall have an equal proportion of my said Estate with the rest of my Children aforementioned at the marriage or death of my said wife

Item my will and desire is that all the rest of my Estate of what
kind soever be and remain in the hands and possession of my
said wife the better to enable her to raise my Children

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint Mary Nicholas
Frederick Nicholas and George Nicholas sole Executors of
this my Will and Testament hereby renouncing all other and
former wills by me heretofore made
