In the name of God, Amen. August 29th 1774

I Thomas Ford of Fairfax County and Colony of Virginia being weak of body but perfect
in memory, thanketh to almighty God for it. I do appoint constitute and ordain this to my
last Will and Testament touching all Will or Writs heretofore by me made and this to stand
and remain first I give and bequeath my Soul to almighty God that gave it and my body
to the dust to be buried in such decent Order as my Executors shall think fit.
Hence first my Will and desire is that all my just Debts may be fully satisfied and paid
Hence first I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Ford the use of the plantation
whereon I now live and all the land lying between the long branch, and the Rattle snake
branch not ~~not~~ in the gift of Joseph Woods Lease during her natural life or widowhood
I do give the use of two Slaves to her during her natural life or widowhood and after her
decease or marriage for the Slaves to be sold at six or twelve months Credit as the Executors
shall think most proper having bond and Security of the purchasers and the money arising
from such sale to be equally divided among my four daughters ~~of~~ ^{John} Ann, Elizabeth Ford the
widow of William King and Ann Ford the wife of John Torrey and Catty Ford the wife of John
Simpson and Priscilla Ford the wife of Josiah Ferguson.

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved Son John Ford one half of the said Ingleff at the
loss end of the tract whereon I now live to him & his heirs for ever

Item the other half of the Land I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Son Edward Ford at the upper end of the tract where James Moore now lives to him this I give for ever

Item I give unto my well beloved daughter Lety Ford the wife of John Simpson one feather
bed furniture and one Cow & Calf

Item I give unto my daughter Sarah Ford the wife of Thomas Jacobs five pounds current money to be made out of my Estate.

Item I give unto my Grand Daughter Mary Jacobs a suit of Apparel

I leave my wife Jane Ford and my Son Edward Ford Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

I George Hunter of the parish of Fairfax in the County of Fairfax being in perfect health and having a clear memory do will and dispose of my Estate both real & personal in the following manner (except a legacy of \$5 a Year hereafter mentioned) It is first my desire that all my just debts be discharged, I then give and bequeath to my Wife Mother Elizabeth Hunter all the Stock & furniture belonging to me in the Estate of my deceased Father Hen: Spivey & bequeath to my brother John Chapman Hunter the tract of Land lying in Fairfax County

Left me by my Father to him and his heirs for ever provided he or they pay to my Sister
Annelia Deed Fifty pounds Virginia Currency for buying a Negro Girl
Then I bequeath to my brother Nathaniel Chapman Hunter all the Negroes that I shall be
entitled to from my Fathers Estate to him and his heirs for ever on condition he or they pay
to my Sister Margaret Hunter Fifty pounds Virginia Currency to dispose of as she pleases
for I am sensible she would not choose to be restricted in her purchase. In consideration
of the Esteem and love I bear my Uncle George Chapman I give and bequeath to him Ten
Guineas for a purchase of a Ring to wear as a memento of my regard this seventeenth day
of May one thousand seven hundred & sixty six
