my Lands in the Province of Maryland, as soon as they conveniently
can and upon such Credit as they shall think fit and the money
arising from the Sale of the said Lands and the Balance of my
personal Estate above mentioned (if any remains after paying my
Debts) to be by them or the Survivor of them applied to the payment of a
Debt due from my Son Leon to William Balmain of Alexandria
Merchant and likewise in payment for two Lots situate in the Town of
Colchester Contracted for by myself one with M^r Cumberland & Milson
for my Son Leon and the other with M^r William Sempleman for my
Son Sall which Contracts I desire may be carried into Execution by my
Executors and the Conveyances be made to my said Sons Leon and
Sall and their heirs for ever of their respective Lots accordingly and
the oversplus of the Money arising from the Sales of my Personal
Estate & Marylands as aforesaid, after payment of my Debts
and of the several Sums above specified I give to my four Daughters

To be Equally divided amongst them.

Item I give and bequeath to my four Daughters all my Slaves to be by my Executors Equally divided amongst them and their heirs according to the appraised values provided. Mr George Summers who married my Daughter Susanna shall Return the Negroes Stock and other Estate which he Received from me with my said Daughter (or others of Equal Value) into the general appraisement but in case he shall fail or Refuse to make such Return, that I give all my Slaves and the Surplus of the Money arising from the Sales of my personal Estate above mentioned and of my Maryland Lands to my three Daughters Sarah, Jane King, and Ann Pinnow, to be Equally divided amongst them by my Executors, and do utterly Exclude my Daughter Susanna Summers from any part or proportion thereof.

Item, I give and devise to my Son Cleon all that Lot of land with its Appurtenances Situate in the Town of Colchester purchased of Mr Alexander Henderson and whereon I now live to hold the same to him and his heirs for Ever.

Item I give and devise to my Son Cato, and his heirs forever all my Tract of Land with its appurtenances lying in the County of Frederick he paying my Son Cleon two hundred pounds current money at four Annual Payments of Fifty pounds Each the first payment to be made twelve Months after my Death and in case that should happen before my Son Cato comes of full age my Executors are hereby Requested and empowered to borrow Money and make the said Payments to my Son Cleon during his Brothers minority and to Secure and indemnify my said Executors I do further empower them to Enter upon and possess the said Frederick Lands until they are reimbursed the money so borrowed by the profits of the said Land or until my Son Cato his heirs or assigns shall repay it.

Item I empower my Executors and request them (if they can) to agree with my wife for any sum of money which they may think reasonable to be paid her either in whole or by the year in full of her Dowry in my Slaves and to render in their possession so many of my Slaves as shall be sufficient from their heir or the Sale of them to Enable them to make good their Contract with my wife as aforesaid unless

Approved Security be given them by my Daughters who shall be intitled to the Slaves or by their Guardians for the payment of the Money according to their several proportions either to my Executors or to my wife in full of her Dowry as aforesaid
if of Mr William Brent & Damian the sum of
Item, I give to Mr Hannah Brent Eight pounds current Money to be paid her by my Executors within Six Months after my decease.
Item, I give to her Brother, Mr Thomas Reale the like sum of Eight pounds current Money to be paid him by my Executors within Six Months after my decease.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my Friends Hector Ross and Alexander Henderson Gentlemen and my Son Cleon Moore Executors of this my will and in Testimony that this is my only true last Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Seventeenth day of May one thousand Seven hundred and Seventy two
