of my Executor. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Williamson
a five year old horse, and one spinning wheel. Item I give and bequeath to my son
John Williamson, Benjamin Williamson & William Williamson one shilling
a piece Item I give and bequeath to my Daughters Matthew Williamson and
Elizabeth Williamson a shilling a piece Item I give and bequeath to my loving
wife Rachel Williamson and my son Nathan Williamson all my estate to be
equally divided between the two to them & their heirs forever Lastly it is my desire
that my son Nathan Williamson should be my sole and sole Executor of this my
last will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
20 Day of October 1756.
