 Senior of Fairfax County V<sup>t</sup> Parish Virginia being old and  
 infirm of body though of perfect sense and memory blessed be  
 God for it. Do make & design this to be my last Will and Testament  
 Viz<sup>t</sup> First I commit my soul to the care of my blessed Lord  
 God of whom I had it hoping to find his blessed mercy and  
 likewise the mercy of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ & my body  
 to the ground to be buried decently at the discretion of my Ex<sup>ors</sup>  
 and I leave my worldly estate in manner as follows Viz<sup>t</sup>  
 Item first I give and bequeath to my well beloved son John  
 Robertson the tract of land I now live on containing six hun-  
 dred and thirty acres Except in case that the Alexanders should  
 obtain that tract of land adjoining Todd & Evans and if so  
 be then my daughter Jennet Mowmaker Robertson is to have  
 three hundred and twenty Acres of the said John Robertsons land  
 Secondly I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Jennet  
 Mowmaker Robertson the tract of land adjoining Todd & Evans contain-  
 ing six hundred and thirty Acres Thirdly I give and bequeath to my  
 granddaughter Elizabeth Robertson daughter to James Robertson Jun<sup>r</sup>

One hundred acres of land beginning on four mile run and running according to the course of the said land and the remainder of the said tract. I give and bequeath to my well beloved son James Robertson Sr. I give to my son John Robertson my Desk & to my daughter Janet Robertson my round Table & the rest of my Goods and Chattels Moveables and every individual to be equally divided between my wife Elizabeth Robertson & my daughter Janet Roumaker Robertson and my son John Robertson them freely to be possessed & enjoyed & I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannull all & every other former Testaments Wills and Legacies requests and Executors by me in any ways before this time named willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this forth day of September in the year of our Lord God 1768.

I say all my personal estate such as cattle hogs horses and all my household furniture

And lastly I constitute and appoint my said trusty and loving friend Nathan Frizel to be my Executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking and disallowing all former and other Wills by me made acknowledged this and this only to be my true last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this twenty ninth day of July in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and sixty seven
