In the name of God amen. I John Dogen of the
County of Fairfax being of sound and disposing mind
& memory do make & ordain this my last Will & Tes-
tament in manner & form following that is to say Impri-
mis my Will that all my just Debts be paid by my Exors.
herein after mentioned out of the money arising by my
Crop not yet sold

1st Item I give & bequeath unto my two sons Henry Dogen
& John Dogen three negroes to wit Nan Peg & her child
sarah also eight head of Cattle to wit two Cows four
Heifers & 2 Yearlings also sixteen head of Sheep also two
feather Beds & furniture of the value of twenty pounds
& my Will & desire is that the said negroes & Stock beque-
athed to my two sons shall be kept on my plantation
whereon I now live by my Exors until my son Henry
Dogen shall attain to the age of twenty one years
during which time I desire that what profits may
arise from the said negroes and Stock a^d may be apply-
ed to the educating & maintaining my said two sons &
at the time my said Henry shall attain to the age of twenty
one years that the said negroes & Stock & Beds be equally
divided between my two sons Henry & John & if either
of them should die without Issue then the whole to the
survivor

2^d Item I give unto my son Henry Dogen also one roan
mare called Peggy & a saddle & Bridle also to my son
John Dogen one sorrell mare call'd Jon & a saddle and
Bridle over & above what I have before divided

3^d Item I give unto my son Henry & his heirs my planta-
tion whereon I now live he the said Henry suffering and
permitting his brother John Dogens part of the negroes
before given to be kept on the said plantation accor-
ding

To the directions in this my Will before mentioned and also in case the Lease for the ap^d plantation should not be expired at the time my son Henry shall attain to the age of twenty one years my desire is that he pay unto my son John Dogin the sum of twenty pounds is being what I expect is half the value of the said Lease

2^d Item I lend unto my wife Elizabeth Dogin my negro fellow Monday & feather bed of the value of ten pounds & horse called silver & a saddle & bridle & four head of cattle to wit 1 cow three heifers three years old & yearling eight head of sheep to have & to hold the said negro horse & cattle & sheep during her natural life & after her decease to be equally divided between my two sons Henry & John

3^d Item I desire that my horse & mare & all the rest of my estate not before disposed of be sold & the money arising by such sale & also if any ballance of my debts should be left after my debts are paid be equally divided between my wife & two sons.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my wife Elizabeth & my son Henry & Mr. Alexander Henderson my Exors. of this my last Will & Testament. In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of December 1770.
