I John Dogen of the County of Fairfax being of sound and disposing mind & memory do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following That is to say I谨 witness my will that all my just Debts be paid by my executors hereinafter mentioned out of the money arising by my crop not yet sold

1st Item I give & bequeath unto my two sons Henry Dogen & John Dogen three negroes to wit, Nan, Peg & her child Sarah also eight head of cattle to wit two Cows four Heifers & 2 Yearlings also sixteen head of sheep also two Leather Bells & furniture of the value of twenty pounds & my will & desire is that the said negroes & stock bequeathed to my two sons shall be kept on my plantation whereon I now live by myself until my son Henry Dogen shall attain to the age of twenty one years during which time I desire that what profits may arise from the said negroes and stock aforesaid may be applied to the educating & maintaining my said two sons & at the time my said Henry shall attain to the age of twenty one years that the said negroes & stock & Bell be equally divided between my two sons Henry & John & if either of them should die without issue then the whole to the survivor

2^d Item I give unto my son Henry Dogen also one roan mare called Piggy & a saddle & Bridle also to my son John Dogen one sorrell mare called Jon & a saddle and Bridle over & above what I have before devised

3rd Item I give unto my son Henry of his heirs my plantation whereon I now live he the said Henry suffering and permitting his brother John Dogins part of the negroes before given to be kept on the said plantation according

To the directions in this my Will before mentioned and
also in case the lease for the afo^r plantation should not
be expired at the time my son Henry shall attain to the
age of twenty one years my desire is that he pay unto
my son John Dogon the sum of twenty pounds £.²⁰
being what I expect is half the value of the said lease.

4^r. Item I lend unto my wife Elizabeth Dogon my negro
Yellow Monday 1 feather bed of the value of ten pounds
1 horse called silver & a saddle & Bridle & your head of cal
the said will beow three horses three years old 1 yearling with
head of sheep to have & to hold the said negro Horse

her decease to be equally divided between my two sons

5^r. Item I desire that my negro & Mare & all the rest of my
estate not before disposed of be sold & the money arising
by such sale & also of any ballance of my Crop shous
be left after my debts are paid be equally divided
between my wife & two sons.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my wife Elizabeth & my
son Henry & Mr Alexander Henderson my executors of
this my last Will & Testament In witness whereof I have
