

Know all men by these presents that we Gabriel Adams junr & James  
Adams Junr & Francis Hood are here & firmly bound unto William Fairfax Jr:  
his first Justic in the Commission of the Peace for Fairfax County for and  
in behalf of the said Justic & the Board of the Justices of the said County &  
their Successors in the sum of one hundred pounds Sterling to be paid by  
said William Fairfax his Executors admt & Assigned to the whole payment  
well & truly to be made within our lives & memory of us our memory of ours  
hours Executors admt jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed  
with our Seals dated this 19<sup>th</sup> day of May 1743.

The Conditions of this obligation is such that if the above bound Gabriel  
Adams junr admt of all the goods Chattels & Credits of John Lloyd decd do  
make or cause to come into a true and perfect Inventory of all singular the goods  
Chattels & Credits of him and decd which have or shall come to his hands  
possession or purvudge of the said Gabriel Adams junr or into his hands or  
possession of any other person or persons for him & his and do purvudge or  
cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Fairfax at such time as he  
shall be thereto required by the said Court of the hand goods Chattels &  
Credits & all other the goods Chattels & Credits of the said decd at the time  
of his death which at any time after shall come to his hands or  
possession of the said Gabriel Adams junr or into his hands or possession  
of any other person or persons for him & do well & truly administer  
according to law & further downe to adjust his account of his actings &  
deing therin when thereto required by the said Court call the rest and  
Residue of the said Goods Chattels & Credits which shall be found remaining  
upon his said admt account his hand being first examined & followed by  
the Justices of the Court for his time being shall Deliver and pay unto  
such person or persons respectively as the said Justices by their order or  
judgement shall direct pursuant to the laws in that case made & provided  
and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will & Testament was  
made by the said decd & the same or any person named to exhibit the same  
into the said Court making request thereto it allowed and approved according  
ly if the said Gabriel Adams junr being therunto required to render and  
deliver up his Letters of Administrations approbation of such Testament  
being first had & made in the said Court then this obligation to be void

or else to remain in full force & virtue.

In the name of God Amen I Richard Kirkland of the County of  
Fairfax being sick of body bound of mind in my greatest infirmities & praised by God for  
his grace & sake make ordinance apponit to his body my last will & Testament containing  
dispensing all former wills & Testaments formerly made by me containing these  
my last will & Testament in manner following as first & greatest and  
bequeath my spirit to hands of Almighty God my heavenly father hoping that  
through his mercies death & passion of Jesus Christ my Lord & savior to receive  
no pardoun & forgiuenes of all my sins & to obtain a joyfull reuinction at  
the last day as for my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors  
hereinafter named.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Kirkland all my right title and  
claim which I have to a tract of Land containing two hundred acres of land  
being known by the name of Brown's farm lying & being in Baltimore  
County.

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary the plantation on  
which now lies all the Land belonging therunto during the term of her  
natural life & after her decease to my son Robert Kirkland & his heirs for  
ever my son Robert Kirkland paying my son John Kirkland ten pounds  
current money of Virginia.

Item all my moveable estate I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife  
Mary during the term of her natural life & after her decease to be equally  
Divided amongst all my Sons & Daughters.

Item I appoint my well beloved wife Mary & George Lellicord to be my executors  
of this my last Will & Testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this seventeenth  
day of November, 1742.
